
#### **Chapel Hart**

Born and raised in the Mississippi mud and slow-simmered in Louisiana spice, Chapel Hart has brought a taste of the South to audiences around the world—and everyone is craving more! Made up of sisters Danica and Devynn Hart along with first cousin Trea Swindle, their meteoric rise came shortly after appearing on *America's Got Talent* and receiving the second ever "Group Golden Buzzer". Deemed as "America's Sweethearts" as they claimed a spot in the finals, Chapel Hart received praises from country music pillars such as Tanya Tucker, Darius Rucker and the one and only Dolly Parton. Shortly afterwards, the ladies made their Grand Ole Opry debut and received 4 standing ovations. Chapel has since returned to that iconic stage several times and has quickly become a mainstay in the country music industry.

This independent band has hit the ground running, contending with some of the nation's biggest country stars and it doesn't seem like they're slowing down anytime soon.

The group has recently been named one of Music Row's "Next Big Thing" for 2023 and CMT just announced that they are a part of their Listen UP class 2023 roster. 


#### The Greatest Piano Men

Set in 1888 Oklahoma Indian territory, this show follows Bass Reeves and his Native American companion as they seek out two criminals fleeing to the Mexican border, one of whom Reeves has a death warrant for. But soon, they find themselves stuck in an old saloon as a deadly tornado slowly approaches.

#### **Revisiting Creedence**

Saturday, Oct. 14, 2023 • 7:30 p.m.


They toured the world with original Creedence Clearwater Revival members & Rock and Roll Hall of Famers, now they're continuing the CCR legacy live in concert.

Revisiting Creedence's front men Dan McGuinness and Kurt Griffey, lead vocal and lead guitar respectively, performed over the past decade with rock royalty, fronting Creedence Clearwater Revival founding members Stu Cook and Doug "Cosmo" Clifford's touring project, Creedence Clearwater Revisited.



After the resounding success of the Beethoven Ninth in 2022, the Memphis Symphony and the UM Choirs collaborate again on a presentation of Carmina Burana, a cantata written by Carl Orff. The composer based his work on 24 poems from the medieval collection Songs of Beuern. This work is a perennial favorite with modern audiences with its spectacular evocation of how fate and fortune impact lives.

Many people will recognize the famous movement "O Fortuna" that begins and ends the work. Commercials and movie tracks have used this exuberant piece to invoke a majestic and other-worldly atmosphere. Based on the idea of the turning Wheel of Fortune, the listener will hear joy, bitterness. hope and grief as the compositional structure moves through a melodic conversation supported by powerful rhythmic energy in the large orchestra dominated by brass and percussion. The cantata features three soloists who lead a large chorus of voices.

# Gertrude Castellow Ford

ith an ever-inquisitive mind, Gertrude Castellow Ford fully embraced the arts. As a patron, an observer and a practitioner, Ford engaged in a lifelong exploration of all things of beauty and inspiration, and held true to classic traditions in the fine arts. She was an accomplished flutist, violinist and pianist as well as fluent in French, Latin and Spanish. Exceedingly well-read in poetry and classic literature, she was often at the center of spirited discussions about the merits of all manner of literary works and was not afraid to raise challenging concepts in literature, especially concerning the authorship of Shakespeare's plays. Always at the very foundation of her spirit was a great and sincere love of the arts and letters.

Raised in a generations-old tradition of philanthropy, Ford established the Gertrude C. Ford Foundation in Jackson with a generous gift in 1991. In 1998, the Ford Foundation awarded the University of Mississippi \$20 million to design and build the Gertrude C. Ford Center for the Performing Arts on the Oxford campus. This regal facility is a physical testament to Ford's lifelong dedication to the arts. Ford died in September 1996. She and her husband, Aaron Lane Ford, who was an Ackerman attorney and U.S. congressman representing what was Mississippi's 4th District, are buried in Cuthbert, a small town in southwest Georgia.
